Coalburn Miners Welfare Accordian and Fiddle Club's first meeting of 2008 will be on **17th January** when the guest is John Morgan.



### Profile by John Zawadzki

# Mrs Anne Isabel DOUGLAS

Maiden Name Todd Born Edinburgh 1869

Married Dr Charles Douglas in 1895 Moved to Auchlochan in 1900

"One of the greatest benefactresses ever to live in the parish was Mrs Anne Douglas. It was not that she merely gave money to good causes but more important have of her time" - the late Jim Hamilton, Coalburn Chronicles.

Mrs Douglas was an indefatigable worker for the local community.

Founder of New Trows and Lesmahagow WRIs

For ten years she was chairman of Lesmahagow Parish Council, holding the office during the difficult period of the Great Strike of 1926.

She established a junior drama group - the New Trows Players; directed an adult drama group which performed for charities in many surrounding villages; and trained a junior choir which competed at the Lanark Music Festival.

In 1930, at the time of The Great Depression, and with millions unemployed, Mrs Douglas started a toy factory known as the Auchlochan Toymakers Group, employing local men. The toys were mainly swinging parrots shaped in wood, toys with wheels, etc. The workshop was a garden shed to start with but later a larger room was provided by her.

Awarded MBE for her role managing Women's Land Army in South Lanarkshire during Second World War.

Died Auchlochan, December 1956.

Buried at Lesmahagow New Cemetery alongside her husband.
