# Frank Alistair Beaton Wills M.A.

rank Wills was unique in that he was Headmaster of both of the schools in the village. He was at Bellfield from 1918 until 1938 before being promoted to Coalburn where he remained until he retired in 1946 due to failing health.

He was born in Balquidder, north of The Trossachs where his grandfather was a crofter. He served in the Forces during the 1914-18 war at which time he sustained injuries which were to trouble him throughout his life. His tenure in the area was of great benefit not only to his many pupils but also to the community in general as he played an active part in many of the local organisations. He was the Chief Warden in the A.R.P. unit during the Second World War, a prominent Freemason, and a Church elder. He had the honour of acting as Lord-in-Waiting at the Gala Day in 1937 when the first Gala Queen was crowned by his wife. A keen sportsman, he was adept with a billiard cue and a worthy opponent in "The Better 'Ole" on many occasions as a carpet bowler.

The works of Robert Burns was one of his great passions and he was a regular participant in local Burns Suppers. It is recorded that he proposed "The Immortal Memory" on at least 49 occasions. He was also adept at putting pen to paper himself in the manner of the bard.

His fondness for all concerned within the village can be discerned from the following entry in the Bellfield School Log Book dated 18<sup>th</sup> November 1938.

This day I ended my occupation of the post of headmaster at Bellfield P. School. I cannot demit office without recording;

(1) The excellent work and pleasant co-operation of my colleagues, Miss Harvie and Miss Watt.

(2) The cordial relations that have existed between the staff of this school on the one hand, and the children and their parents on the other.

I was the recipient of a gift of books from my colleagues, and a dressing case and reading lamp from the pupils, from whom Mrs. Wills received a handsome handbag and scarf. I can assure both teachers and pupils that we both appreciate their gifts very much.

I conclude this log by remarking that the 20 years spent as headmaster of Bellfield School have been full of happiness, both in work, and socially, and hope that my successor will find his lines cast in equally pleasant places.

# Lesmahagow: Past & Present 2nd MAJOR EXHIBITION
