

Wi' needles in my knickers.



The Station Hotel was built at Coalburn to provide good accommodation for surveyers and mining engineers visiting to undertake developing work in the coalmines. The Kirk Session of Coalburn Church objected in 1897 to the granting of a licence being of the opinion that no additional facilities were necessary for the sale of intoxicating liquor.


